The short article titled “Risk Assessment of Ambient Air Pollutants and Health Impact around Fuel Stations in Urban Cities of KSA” published in International Journal of Preventive Medicine, on page 91, Volume 12, Issue 8, 2021,^[1] is being retracted because of ethical concerns found in the article and there is a substantial content overlap with another article titled “Assessment of BTEX concentration around fuel station in Eastern Province Kingdom of Saudi Arabia” published in International Journal of Environmental Health Engineering, on page 2, Volume 10, 2021.^[2]
