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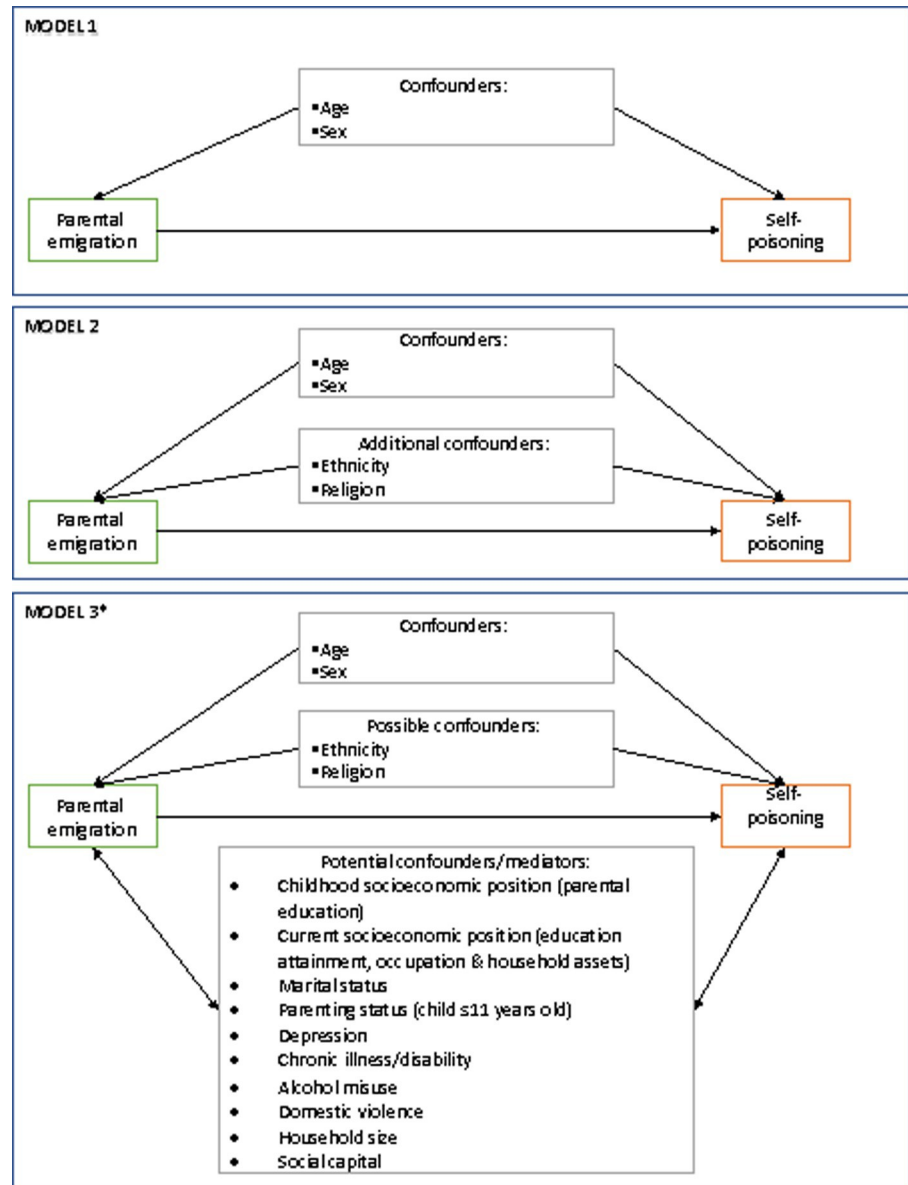
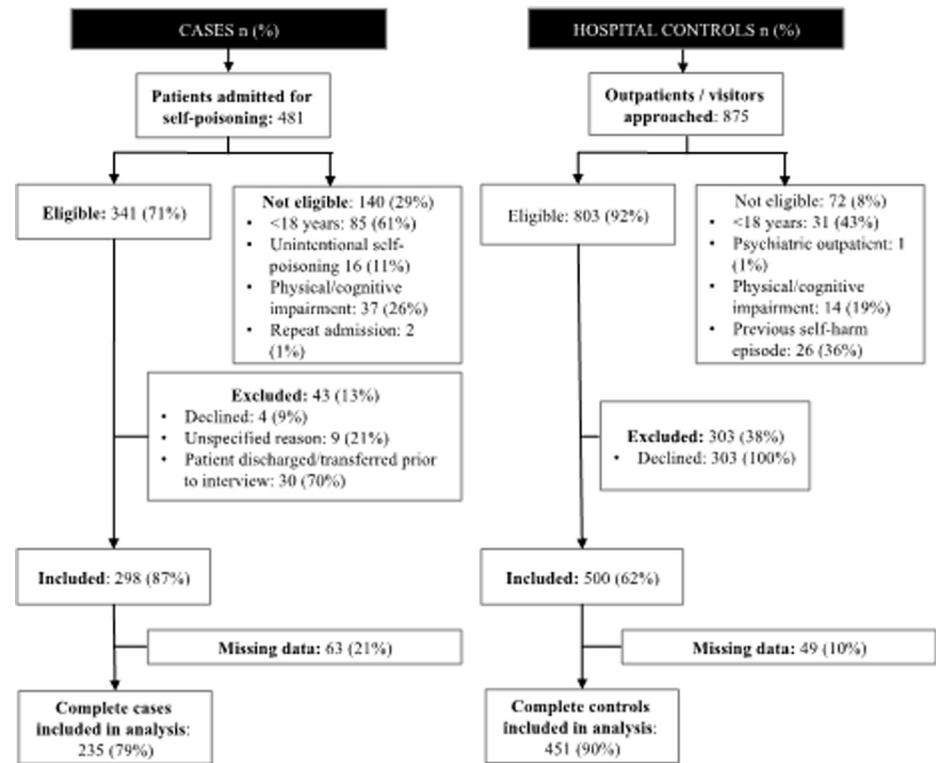


Fig 1. Graphical presentation of the conceptual models used to inform statistical analysis.
