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Bilateral giant cell arteritis with skin necrosis: case report

An 82-year-old man developed bilateral giant cell arteritis (GCA) with skin necrosis following Covid-19 vaccination with tozinameran. The man presented with headaches, jaw claudication, bilateral temporoparietal skin necrosis, weight loss and almost complete vision loss for 4 months. He stated that his symptoms appeared about 10 days after receiving the second dose of tozinameran [BTN162b2; *route and dose not stated*]. Subsequent cutaneous findings, fundoscopy, ultrasound, temporal artery biopsies and elevated CRP levels confirmed bilateral late-stage GCA with skin necrosis secondary to tozinameran [*outcome not stated*].
