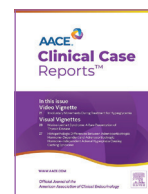




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Editorial

Under the pituitary-gonadal-adrenal access in this issue, uncommon cause of hypopituitarism was described due to Pituitary abscess [1], another report suggests the association of adenomyosis with hyperprolactinemia [2], another case reviewed the rare presentation of recurrent laryngeal nerve paragangliomas [3]

An interesting visual vignette described a case of hypogonadotropic hypogonadism due to intracranial kissing carotid arteries seen on pituitary magnetic resonance images[4]

On Diabetes, Lipids, and Metabolism, we share a clinical case highlighting the importance of considering genetic mutations associated with neonatal diabetes and identifying the clinical manifestation of neonatal diabetes [5], another case highlighted antipsychotic induced hyperglycemia, and diabetes ketoacidosis with certain medications such as Olanzapine [6]

In the field of thyroid disease, a unique presentation of occult papillary thyroid cancer in an adolescent patient is described [7] a visual vignette described ulcerated thyroid tumor [8]

In the area of Bone and calcium disorders: a case of mastocytosis induced atypical hip fracture was described [9].

Lastly, and under the "Interpretation of Endocrine Testing" category, a case described potential causes of false-positive uptake on parathyroid scan [10]
