We have an Editorial Review Board consisting of over 75 members, an Editorial Board that we share with *GIE*, 6 Editorial Advisory Board members, 2 Associate Editors, and 2 Co-Editors-in-Chief.

This is only the beginning. Our minds are full of ideas and possibilities, and we encourage you to tell us your ideas as well!
