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# Publisher Correction: HIV-1 replication complexes accumulate in nuclear speckles and integrate into speckle-associated genomic domains

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The original version of this Article contained several errors in Fig. 7. In Fig. 7a, the PF74 concentration for the middle panel was incorrectly labelled as ‘25’, rather than the correct ‘2.5’. In Fig. 7b, the PF74 concentration for the blue series was incorrectly labelled as ‘25’, rather than the correct ‘2.5’. In Fig. 7c, the PF74 concentration for the third panel from the top was incorrectly labelled as ‘25’, rather than the correct ‘2.5’. In Figs. 7d and e, the PF74 concentrations for the green series were incorrectly labelled as ‘2.5’, rather than the correct ‘25’.
